Method Statement

Noah's Ark Zoo Farm is a working zoo set in over 100 acres of countryside with 100 species of animals on site. A wide variety of activities can be participated in during school and group visits including walking around the site, viewing the animal collection, animal petting & feeding, taking part in daily/educational events or workshops and playing in the play areas. All animal enclosures are kept locked to prevent public access. All public areas of the zoo have separate individual risk assessments and are maintained and inspected daily.

These are guidelines only and teachers and group leaders are recommended to complete their own risk assessment prior to the visit.

We review our risk assessment annually unless there are any changes in the meantime.

Residual risk to be calculated after all reasonably practicable control measures have been implemented. Residual risk score –Likelihood (L) x Severity (S) =Residual Risk (RR). See matrix on front page.
